To Abigail, wife of Nabal, one of the boys reported "Look! David sent messengers out of the wilderness to greet our lord; and he screamed at them. Yet the men were very good to us, and we were not put to shame, and we never missed anything all the days we were with them when we were in the field. They were a wall to us even by night and also every day; we were with them, keeping the sheep. Now know this and see what you can do; for evil against our master and against all his house has been resolved; he is worthless, no one can speak to him."

1 Corinthians 7:1-8

Lector (A reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians)

Now, about what you have written It is good for a man not to take hold of a woman. But because of sexual immorality, each man should have his own woman and each woman her own man. For the wife, the husband should do his duty and likewise the wife for her husband. For the wife does not have authority over her own body, rather the husband does; likewise the husband does not have authority over his own body, yet the wife does. Do not ever defraud each another except by agreement for a time to devote yourselves to prayer, and then come together again so that Satan may not tempt you because of your lack of self-control. This I say as a concession not a command. I wish that all were as I myself am. But each has their own gift from God, indeed one to one and another to another. To the unmarried and the widows I say that it is good for them to remain so. But if they are not showing self-control, they should marry; for it is better to marry than to burn.

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy, catholic and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Intercessor For our President, those who serve in our national and local legislative bodies, and those who sit on courts of justice, that they may be given godly wisdom and insight for those decisions which fall into shadows of uncertainty; let us pray.

Hear us, God of Mercy.

Intercessor In thanksgiving for the new life that awaits all who engage in the daily reality of death and resurrection, remembering especially all who have died; let us pray. Hear us, God of Mercy.

Intercessor and People together We rejoice that we are created in your image. Free us from racism and any other prejudice that defiles us. May the church at all time reveal your glory and lead many to the glorious liberty that is for the children of God.
